Dear Parents

I hope you have enjoyed the half term break. I would like to share these updates with you.

Class News

<u>Rainbow Class</u> Children enjoyed a visit from our local police and were able to go and see their police van. They learned all about what the police do to help us. In maths, the children have been learning all about addition and used colourful semantics to learn about The Gingerbread Man story.

Nursery Children have enjoyed sharing traditional tales like The Gingerbread Man. They made and decorated their own gingerbread men, which were delicious. This week, some pupils in nursery will take part in Forest School activities and learn about making shelters, building, exploring and using natural materials to create new environments.

Reception The children had a very exciting visit from our local police officers who brought their police van for them to see. The children enjoyed sitting in the van, exploring the inside of the van and hearing the sirens. They recognised special numbers on the side like 999 and 101 and we discussed what they meant and when you'd need to use those numbers. They completed some wonderful writing using their phonics to write simple sentences such as "I can see the van, I went in the van".

Year One As part of their history topic about houses and homes, children had a trip to the Abbey House Museum where they handled objects from long ago such as washing tubs, wringers and vacuums. We all enjoyed their assembly when they shared the story of The Enormous Turnip and learned lots of songs. Year Two As part of their science topic about what humans and animals need to survive, class two had a visit from Winnie to learn about all the things a dog needs. They could see many things were the same for

dogs as humans and asked some brilliant questions. They also had a visit from the Teddy Bear Hospital from Leeds University. The medical students taught them how to keep their teeth healthy by regular brushing, basic first aid and what to do in a medical emergency. They had a great time, and their teddy bears did too.

<u>Year Three</u> As part of their history about Romans, the children had a fantastic day at Murton Park where they became Roman soldiers for the day. They learned to march, fight, make clay pots and learn about the way Romans lived. They have made catapults in design technology in the style Romans would have used. Children also had a visit from D:Side to learn about keeping safe online.

<u>Year Four</u> The children have enjoyed learning about Ancient Egypt in history this term. They attended an Egyptian workshop at Leeds City Museum and saw some real Egyptian artefacts. In science, they created electrical circuits, including making switches and learnt about the history of electricity. Parents also attended a meeting about the times table check that pupils will be taking later this year.

Year Five In history children have started to learn about the Victorians and have been reading extracts from Oliver Twist, which links with the topic. They have produced exciting newspapers about 'Pickpockets on the Prowl' in the city of London. They had a fantastic drama workshop all about Victorian Workhouses. Year Six In history pupils are learning about World War Two and are looking forward to their trip to Leeds Industrial Museum. As part of art, they visited local graffiti displays and explored the different opinions around graffiti.



Other News

Football Once again Mr Robertson and Mr Leigh have entered the league cup with the school football team. They have taken part in 2 matches this half term, winning them both. They have more to play but are doing extremely well and are currently top of the league.

<u>Keeping Safe Day</u> During our recent themed day, children explored keeping safe online, bullying, knowing which adults they can trust, what a healthy and safe friendship is and what to do if they are worried about anything. They had discussions, games, presentations, and problem solving through stories and film clips. At school we have talked to all pupils about how to cross a road safely and to always wear a seat belt in a car.

Lent Fundraising This half term we will begin our journey through Lent. This is an important part of the Christian year where we prepare for Easter and have time to reflect on the journey Jesus took. We will be asking the children to suggest suitable charities to raise money for. Each class will also be given time to raise money by either selling cakes or biscuits or by running competitions.

Parents Group Many parents have been attending the group with Leeds City College each week. It has been lovely to see how much they have enjoyed and contributed to the sessions.

<u>Attendance</u> Congratulations to all our families on excellent attendance so far this year. Since September our attendance stands at 97.8%. We have chosen children from those who had 100% attendance and have never been late for a prize.

Rotary Recital Award Our final took place before the holiday with fourteen finalists performing their poems in front of a panel of judges. A huge thank you to everyone who encouraged their child to learn a poem for our Rotary Recital Competition. The winners were Vivaan Paturkar in key stage one and Ebony-Rae Henry in key stage two. Congratulations to them both. All finalists received a poetry book and certificate.

<u>Parking</u> A huge thank you to all you parents who are parking at Bridge Community Church before and after school. It has made a HUGE difference to the safety outside school. Please can more parents try and park there to take the pressure off the road outside school.
